The 10th Edition of the meeting will take place May 29 - June 1 in Toronto. Our presidential speaker will be Dr John O'Keefe (University College London), he is the recipient of last year's Nobel Prize in Medicine and received his PhD from McGill University in 1967.

CAN Young Investigator Award

Awarded yearly at our annual meeting since 2011, the CAN **Young Investigator Award** recognizes outstanding research achievements by a young neuroscientist at the early stage of his or her career. .
